Material	• What to recycle	How to prepare	• Do NOT include
Paper	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Newspapers/inserts • Magazines, catalogs, junk mail, glossy, mixed and high-grade paper and paper bags • Phonebooks • Corrugated cardboard, paperboard (cereal boxes) 	Place DRY PAPER loose inside of recycling bin or in brown paper bag placed next to or on top of bin.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No tissues, napkins or other soiled paper. • No plastic bags. • No coated or carbon paper. • No cereal box lining. • No pizza boxes.
Glass Containers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clear, green and brown containers 	Rinse clean. Labels may be left on.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No other glass items such as light bulbs, window glass, dishes, glasses, Pyrex or other glass cooking items
Metal Cans	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Deposit and non-deposit beverage cans • Metal food cans 	Rinse clean. Labels may be left on. May flatten.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No paint or aerosol cans. • No aluminum foil.
Plastic Containers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plastic milk or juice jugs, soda and detergent bottles • All plastic labeled 1-7 	Rinse clean. Crush or nest when possible.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No plastic bags. • No motor oil containers. • No unmarked plastic.
Waste Motor Oil	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • May be taken to the Waste Oil recycling shed, weekdays 7am to 3pm, Saturdays 9am to 3pm. • Closed holidays. • The Waste Oil shed is inside the DPW yard, behind the fence. Look for the yellow sign.
